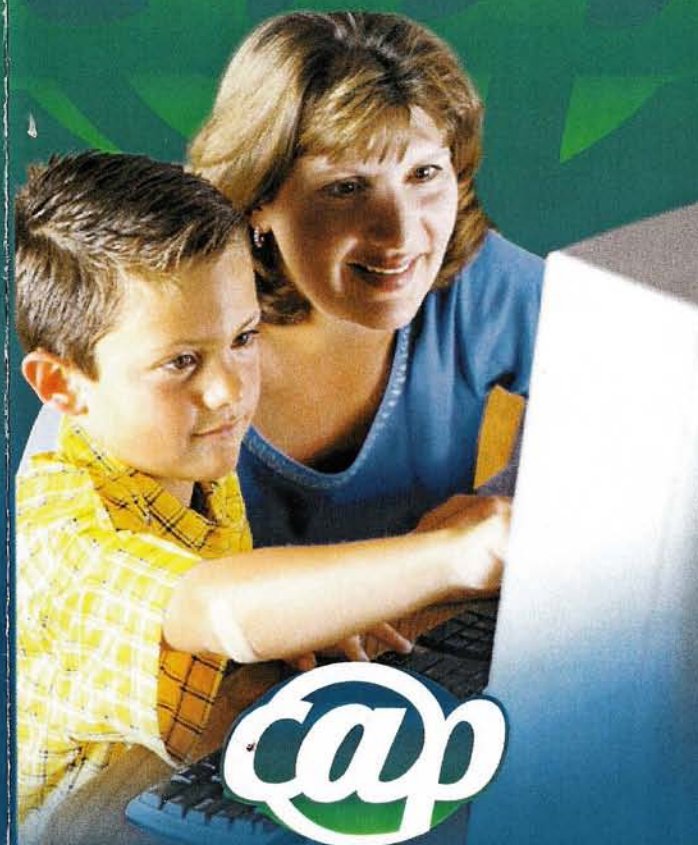

The Community Access Program provides rural and urban communities in Canada with **affordable access** to the Internet and computer-related technologies.

In 1998, the Government of Canada and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador partnered to produce the Canada/Newfoundland and Labrador Community Access Program, paving the way for the information highway in this province.

Today the Department of Education administers nearly **two hundred** active CAP sites province-wide.
